"You're looking at him, Billy boy. You're looking at him."

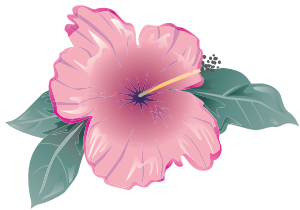
