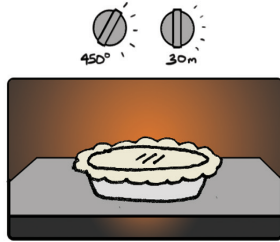


The Gateway guide to baking a pie



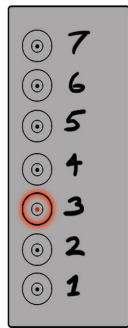
STEP 1: Combine ingredients in bowl

STEP 3: You're doing it wrong. What were you even thinking?



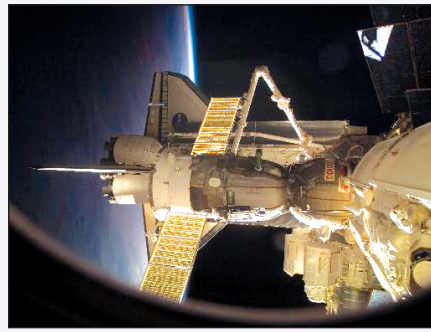
